The Power of Referrals

Referral Networking is essentially turning

networking on its head. When you meet someone, instead of asking "What can I get from this person?" you switch to thinking "What can I give to this person". Port Townsend History Month

Think you know your town? Have a handle on events both past and current? March is Port Townsend History Month. Come discover the complex history of where you live with free Saturday History Tours and the Port Townsend Victorian Festival.

Saturdays through March enjoy free downtown history tours courtesy of Jefferson County Historical Society. Experience "Sin at Sea Level: Historic Walking tour." A guide takes you on a tour of Water Street, chosen by Architectural Digest to be one of the 15 most beautiful Main Streets in America. Hear tales of Port Townsend's rowdy seaport days, see beautiful historical architecture, and learn about some of the colorful characters who built the town in the 1800s and revital-

ized it as an arts community and counter-culture haven in the 1900s.

Tours start at the Jefferson Museum of Art & History, 540 Water Street, at 2pm on Saturdays March 3, 10, 17 and 31st. Tours are free to the public.

March 23-25, Port Townsend's Victorian Festival connects our present with the Victorian past. Celebrating its 32nd year, the Festival includes a host of events ranging from dances to teas to historical fencing demos. This year's theme is Legends of Literature. Come hear the stories that form our sense of self and the stories that defined the era, from Alice in Wonderland to Sherlock Holmes. Learn how theater and fish are only part of the story of why this was the Key City for the US's northwestern expansion.

The Festival explores the history, crafts, and trades of our town and the era surrounding its birth. Dreams brought people here, but once they arrived it was a lot of hard work that built their city. This year's downtown construction projects have been tough but compare those challenges to the years when streets were unpaved and high tides regularly swamped Water Street. Traffic and parking might be a challenge now, but the deep cuts into the bluff that gave access to uptown and downtown are comparatively new and required years of hard labor. To properly appreciate Port Townsend's bright future, come get a perspective on its fascinating history.



This year's midday Fashion Show on Saturday, March 24th, sits amongst a full day of exhibitions, tours, steamboat rides and high teas. In the evening, dust off your dancing shoes for the Victorian Ball featuring Broken Dreams string band with callers to keep you tapping your toes into the night. 
